Student Debt Relief

You may have heard about the one-time student loan debt relief plan in the news. Who is eligible? The Department of Education states the plan "will provide up to \$20,000 in debt relief to Federal Pell Grant recipients and up to \$10,000 in debt relief to non-Pell Grant recipients. Borrowers with loans held by ED are eligible for this relief if their individual income is less than \$125,000 (or \$250,000 for households)."

If you are eligible, there are steps you will need to take. To stay on top of deadlines and get the most accurate and up to date information, go to <u>studentaid.gov</u>.
