Clean Air and Cozy Homes

Clean air indoors is vital during winter. As we seal our homes against the cold, we can trap pollutants inside, like dust, allergens, and pet dander. Air filters act as a silent guardian, capturing these particles and preventing them from circulating. For people who rely on wood stoves or fireplaces, a quality air filter is even more crucial for removing wood smoke particles. Fall Home Maintenance Checklist

A few proactive, preventative steps to keep your home comfortable and your appliances running efficiently this time of year.

- Test smoke & carbon monoxide detectors
- Check and change air filters
- Inspect and clean all heating ducts and vents
- Locate water shut off valve to prepare for freezing temperatures
- Check door and window seals for drafts and apply weather stripping as needed.
- Stock up on emergency supplies: non-perishable food items, water, flashlights, and extra batteries!

Oregon Property Taxes—Bill 101

Check your mailbox this month for your property tax bill! Every homeowner will receive a copy of their property tax bill on or before October 25.

Wondering what the color of your statement means?

YELLOW A mortgage company or tax deferral program has requested your property tax bill. They will pay by the deadline to receive the full 3% discount.

GREEN Property owner is responsible for paying the bill. If you have paid off your mortgage, your property tax bill is paid by you. Reach out to your bank or mortgage servicer for more information and support!

RED Your bill may be past-due. Read the entire notice for specific instructions and reach out to the tax office for more information.

You can pay your bill online, by phone, by mail, or in person at the county building. To receive a discount, payments must be delivered, U.S. postmarked, or paid online by the dates below.

Pay by Nov. 15*	Receive discount	Additional payment due
Full amount	3%	No further payment
2/3 full amount	2%	Final payment due May 15
1/3 full amount	No Discount	Second payment due Feb. 15; final payment due May 15

^{*}If the 15th falls on a weekend or holiday, the due date is the next business day.

Annual Event Recap


It was wonderful to see everyone and celebrate homeownership at our Home SAFE Home event on September 20. We are already looking forward to next year's fun!
