Hope starts with a home

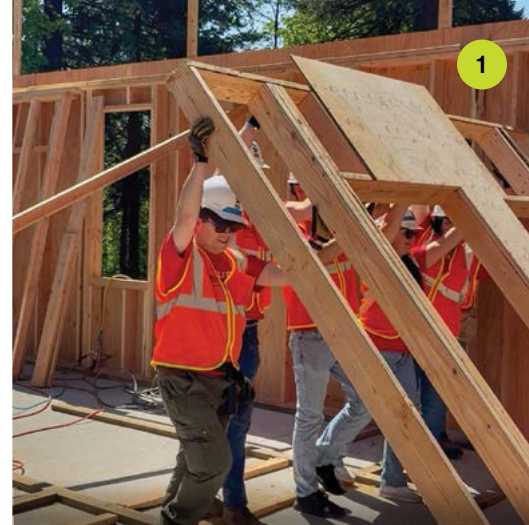

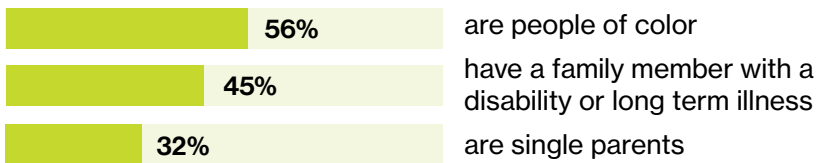

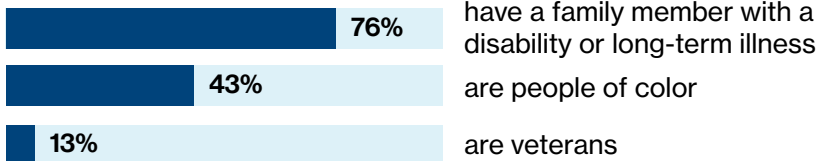

Powering Habitat's mission



Volunteering

2,547 volunteers dedicated 60,903 hours on our construction sites, ReStores, and offices.
16 volunteers joined the Brauner Circle of Volunteer Excellence, celebrating those who dedicate over **2,000 hours** with Habitat.

Donors

6,729 donors contributed \$5.6 million to support Habitat's housing programs and community impact.

Advocacy

21 Habitat staff and volunteers joined the Unlocking Homeownership Coalition's Lobby Day, **meeting with 67 legislators** at the Capitol in Salem.
Habitat connected local advocates to the statewide Unlocking Homeownership campaign, which mobilized **4,441 messages to lawmakers**.

ReStore

8,600 tons of reusable materials diverted from landfills
49,454 donations of building materials and household items received from our community
1,455 residential donation pickups
With \$5,011,399 in purchases, shoppers contributed to building and repairing homes in our community.

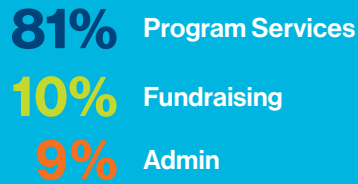
Our 2025 Fiscal Year: July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025
